1 Salisbury Guildhall

Imposing municipal building dating from 1795 overlooking Guildhall Square in the centre of the city. Home to Salisbury's two annual CAMRA beer festivals.



2 Avon Brewery

75 Castle Street 01722 334744

Victorian pub close to city centre with excellent Victorian frosted glass bow window frontage. Long single room. Garden extends to a riverside terrace.



3 Bell & Crown

83 Catherine Street

07564 583772

An attractive and popular pub dates from the 17th century and consists of a large single bar split up into many drinking areas.



4 Bishops Mill

7 The Maltings 01722 412127

Very large pub between Fisherton Street and the Maltings. Two bars on different levels with Mezzanine gallery and riverside garden, a popular lunch spot for visitors.



5 Bridge Tap

12 - 14 Fisherton Street. 01722 321024

Situated in an historic chapel, pleasant setting alongside river with small patio onto street separated by railings. One large bar. Popular with younger drinkers and sports fans.



6 Coach & Horses

39 Winchester Street.

01722 654746

Former 15C coaching inn now beautifully refurbished with a number of drinking and eating areas along with a range of real ales and craft beers. Popular dining spot.



7 Deacons

118 Fisherton Street

01722 322866

A friendly, independently owned free house showcasing quality real ale from local breweries. A cosy traditional interior and well-liked by locals.



8 Duke of York

34 York Road. 07881 812218

A very popular free house carrying a good range of real ales and traditional ciders. The focus is on the community with many regular events for the locals.



9 Five Bells

28 Salt Lane. 07881 945334

Open-plan but cosy interior featuring a large comfortable banquet. Quiet and traditional spot with friendly staff and friendly locals.



10 George & Dragon

85 Castle Street 01722 333122

16C, single room pub, very busy at lunch times with local office staff, and popular with locals and regulars. Large garden backs onto river and features a summerhouse.



11 Haunch of Venison

1 Minster Street

01722 411313

Perhaps the favourite pub of visitors, this 14C building has been both a church house and a brothel. On CAMRA's national inventory of historical interiors.



12 Hettie Bells

135 South Western Rd

Cafe-bar serving a wide range of food and drink with long opening hours along with modern décor and a train departures board.



13 Huntsman Tavern

123 Gigant Street

01722 329525

Local community pub with a focus on sports, whether darts and pool or on TV. Variety of events through the week for the regulars.



14 King's Head

1 Bridge Street 01722 342050

Salisbury's Wetherspoons pub is large and busy with an outdoor seating area adjacent to the river. Features several regular real ales and as many as five guest beers.



15 Market Tavern

16 Butcher Row

Busy city-centre pub especially on market days, with dining area upstairs. Dates from 1904 as a public house. Tables outside in the square make for a pleasant summer spot.



16 New Inn

41 New Street 01722 326662

Timber-framed and originally several cottages, parts of the building have stood here since the 14C. There are two bars and a large, well-kept garden.



17 Old Ale & Coffee House

80 Crane Street

01722 410541

A self-proclaimed gastropub also popular with lively groups of local drinkers who are there to enjoy the range of real ales, craft beer, and fine wines.



18 Ox Row Inn

Market Square. 01722 349033

16C, single split-level panelled bar with many drinking areas, and some upstairs dining space. In the summer months seating is set out in the market square.



19 Pheasant

19 Salt Lane. 07523 684067

15C two-bar pub with low beams. Although food now takes centre stage, there is a large lounge area for those who just want a drink. Sheltered courtyard.



20 Qudos

38 Castle Street 01722 433233

A busy music focused pub with a comfortable bar set out to tables. Regular live music several nights per week, and sometimes comedy.



21 Rai d'Or

69 Brown Street. 01722 327137

Probably the city's oldest inn dating from 14C. Fascinating history. Although there is a focus on Thai food this is still very much a pub.



22 Royal George

17 Bedwin Street

07402 449940

15C Inn now named after the sister ship of HMS Victory and has a beam purported to be from that ship. Pictures of ships and sea battles gives this city pub a country feel.



23 Rude Giant Beer House

29 Brown Street

A spacious and often very lively venue, but also welcoming and informal, featuring ales from the Rude Giant Brewery but also craft beers from many others.



24 Sips

4 The Maltings 07871 222724

Friendly craft ale bar featuring 10 fonts serving key-keg and keg craft ales, and there's a wide selection of canned and bottled beers. Quality music played on vinyl.



25 Village Freehouse

33 Wilton Road. 07400 554442

This friendly city local serves at least three ever changing guest beers focussing on local microbreweries and beers unusual for the area, and always one dark ale, mild or porter.



26 Wig & Quill

1 New Street 01722 335665

14C traditional pub with one long bar divided into three drinking areas. Open fires to warm you in the winter, garden and courtyard for the summer.



27 Winchester Gate

113-117 Rampart Road.

01722 503362

Characterful free house, which once provided for travellers at the city's east tollgate. Four changing ales and often traditional ciders from countrywide.



28 Wyndham Arms

27 Estcourt Road 01722 331026

An enviable pub with unusual people from all walks of life and all ages having one thing in common - they enjoy a good pint! Six handpumps serve a selection of Hop Back ales.

Pubs can be closed for refurbishment or other reasons and opening hours vary. Call and check.

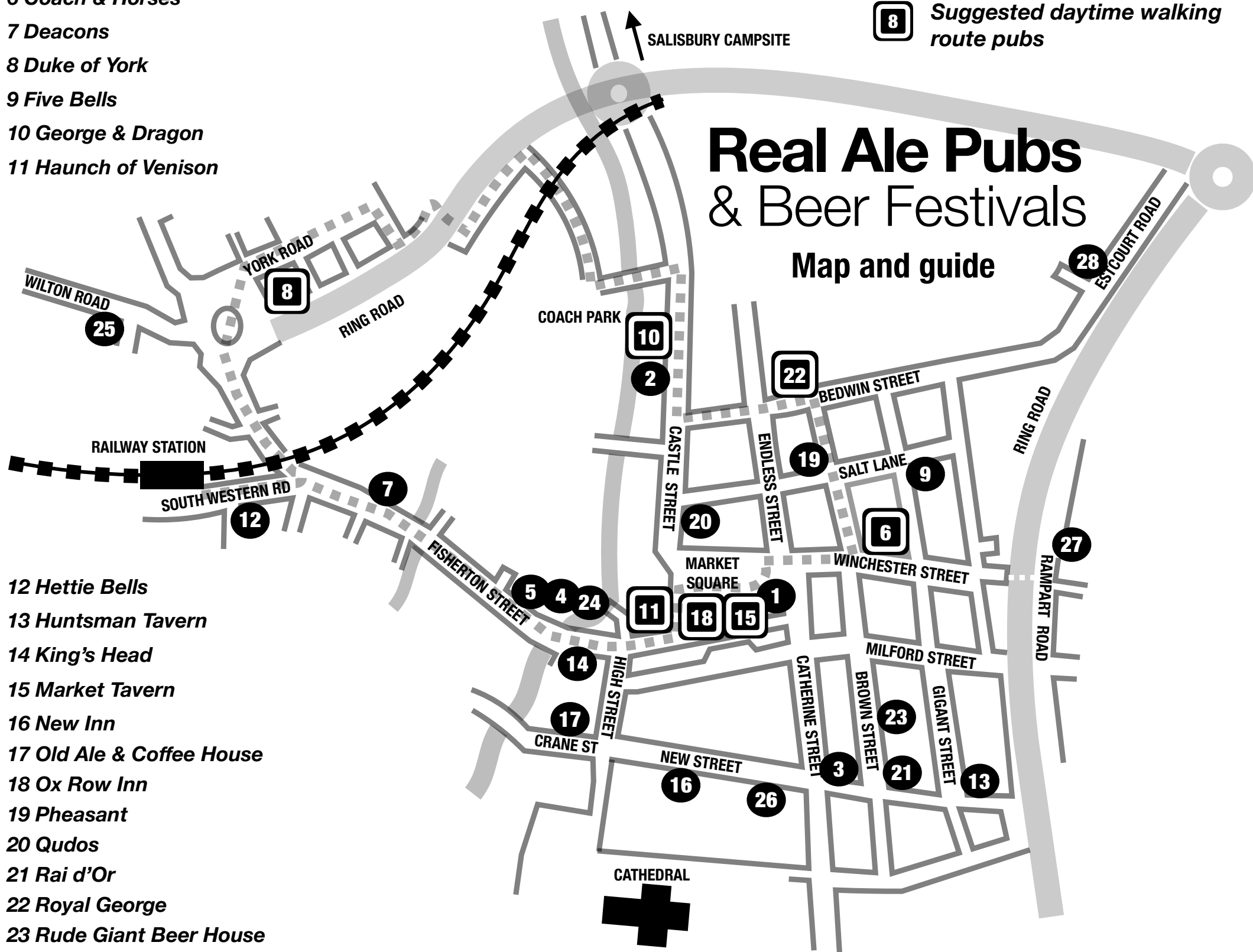

Camra festivals

Salisbury Summerfest takes place around midsummer and includes seasonal summer brews.

Salisbury Winterfest takes place early in the calendar year with a focus on winter ales.

These two-day festivals at the Guildhall feature up to 30 real ales and 4 ciders and are each two sessions: Friday evening and all day Saturday.

Pub festivals

The Winchester Gate hosts two annual festivals – a cider festival at Easter weekend and a beer festival over August Bank Holiday weekend.
